## Observation Schedule June 5, 2018 Statewide Primary Election

The public is invited to observe and participate as the San Bernardino County Elections Office conducts a series of public events related to the election. All events will take place at the San Bernardino County Elections Office according to the following schedule:

### May 7, 2018

- The processing of mail ballot return envelopes begins at 8 a.m. and is performed daily,
   Monday through Friday, until the daily workload is complete.
- The logic and accuracy testing of the County's touchscreen voting machines used for early voting begins at 10 a.m.
- May 17, 2018 The logic and accuracy testing of the County's touchscreen voting machines
  used on Election Day, high-speed ballot scanners, and vote tabulation system begins at 10
  a.m. and continues on May 18, 2018, at 10 a.m.
- May 29, 2018 The counting of mail ballots begins at 9 a.m. and continues periodically, Monday through Friday until the daily workload is complete.

#### June 5, 2018

- Ballots picked up midday from polling places will begin arriving at the Elections Office at 1 p.m.
- All other polling place ballots will arrive after the polls close at 8 p.m.
- o The counting of polling place ballots begins at 4 p.m. and continues until complete.
- June 6, 2018 The official canvass begins at 8 a.m. and will be completed on or before July 5, 2018.
- **June 7, 2018** The random precinct selection for the one percent manual tally of the polling place ballots counted on the high-speed ballot scanners takes place at 10:30 a.m.
- **June 12, 2018** The 100 percent manual tally begins at 10 a.m. for all votes cast on the touchscreen voting machines during the early voting period and on Election Day.
- **June 13, 2018** The random batch selection for the one percent manual tally of the mail ballots counted on the high-speed ballot scanners takes place at 2 p.m.
- **June 14, 2018** The one percent manual tally of the ballots counted on the high-speed ballot scanners begins at 9 a.m.
