ELECTIONS OFFICE REMINDS VOTERS NOV. 8TH IS ELECTION DAY Voters have options for how they cast their ballots

On Tuesday, November 8, 2011 voters who live within the boundaries of districts and cities holding elections, will have the convenience of three options for casting a ballot – visit their assigned polling place, vote early and inperson at the San Bernardino elections office, or vote-by-mail.

Registered voters who choose to vote at the polls can find the location of their assigned polling place on the back cover of the sample ballot pamphlet mailed to their homes, or on the elections office website at www.sbcrov.com, or by calling the Elections Office at (800) 881-VOTE (8683). Some voters may find their polling location has changed from previous elections so it is important that they check the current assigned location before heading out to vote. Polls are open November 8th, from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.

For voters who know that they will be unable to visit the polls on Election Day, early voting is a convenient option, and the service is available at the Elections Office in San Bernardino before Election Day, weekdays between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., as well as Saturday, November 5th, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Finally, voters may mail their vote-by-mail ballots via the U.S. Postal Service. Since all ballots must be received at the elections office by 8 p.m. November 8th in order to be accepted, the Registrar of Voters recommends ballots are mailed no later than November 3rd to give sufficient time to reach the elections office. Ballots postmarked by 8 p.m. on Election Day, but not received in the elections office, according to state law cannot be accepted nor counted.

Voters may also drop off their mail ballots at the following locations:

- Elections Office of the Registrar of Voters, 777 E. Rialto Ave., San Bernardino
- **City Clerks' offices**, during regular business hours in Chino Hills, Fontana, Hesperia, Highland, Montclair, Rancho Cucamonga, Rialto, and Upland
- San Bernardino County Libraries, during regular business hours, including: Chino Branch Library, Chino Hills Branch Library, Summit Branch Library (Fontana), Fontana Lewis Library & Technology Center, Kaiser Branch Library (Fontana), Hesperia Branch Library, Highland Library & Learning Center, Montclair Branch Library, Phelan Memorial Library, Rialto Branch Library
- At any polling place within the county on Election Day, until 8 p.m.
