## \* PRESS RELEASE \* March 5, 2013 Special Municipal Election Reminder

On March 5, elections are being held in the cities of Rialto and Chino Hills, and the Town of Yucca Valley.

Voters in the City of Rialto may vote in person at their assigned polling place or by mail ballot. The polls are open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Election Day. Voters can find their assigned polling place:

- On the back cover of their Voter Information Guide and Sample Ballot
- Online at www.sbcountyelections.com
- By calling the Elections Office at (800) 881-VOTE (8683) or (909) 387-8300 for assistance.

City of Rialto voters who have not returned their voted mail ballots are encouraged to drop them off from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Election Day at the Rialto City Clerk's Office, 290 W. Rialto Ave., any polling place in the City of Rialto or the San Bernardino County Elections Office, 777 E. Rialto Ave., San Bernardino, CA 92415.

Voters in the City of Chino Hills and Town of Yucca Valley are participating in an all-mail ballot election.

Voters who still have not mailed back their voted mail ballots are encouraged to drop them off on Election Day at the San Bernardino County Elections Office from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.

Voters in Chino Hills may drop off their ballots at the Chino Hills City Clerk's office, 14000 City Center Drive from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. and the James S. Thalman Chino Hills Branch Library, 14020 City Center Drive during regular business hours.

Voters in Yucca Valley may drop off their ballots at the Town of Yucca Valley Town Hall, 57090 29 Palms Highway from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. or Town of Yucca Valley Public Library, 57098 29 Palms Highway during regular business hours.

Ballots must be received by 8 p.m. on Election Day in order to be accepted. A ballot postmarked on Election Day, but not received in the Elections Office, will not be counted.
