## Mail Ballots Delivered to San Bernardino County Voters New Drive-Thru, Drop-off Locations

Mail ballots are being delivered to San Bernardino County voters' mailboxes Monday and Tuesday, October 15 and 16 for the 2012 Presidential General Election. Only voters who are on the permanent mail ballot list or voters who have requested a mail ballot for this election will be sent ballots. All other voters will vote at their assigned polling place on Election Day.

Voted mail ballots can be returned to the Elections Office by mail and require 65 cents postage. Voters may also return their voted ballots prior to Election Day to any one of 55 locations in San Bernardino County including any City Clerk's office or any County Library. On Election Day, November 6, 2012 voters may drop off their mail ballots at any of the County's 444 polling places.

New this election, voters also have the option to drop their voted mail ballots at any one of the three drive-thru locations listed below:
